



TATSFIELD PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD 15TH APRIL 2024

Today came the great news that Ship Hill is now open to all traffic again — it has been a long time for our village to be cut in two. I am surely not the only victim of a smashed wing mirror negotiating the narrow lanes? The tidying of the verges will be taking place over the following few days, and I hope by the time you read this it has been finished. Hopefully our water supply has now been brought up to date.

Planning

2024/189/NH 4 Sunnybank this was reported on in March and was for minor amendments which were approved by TDC before our meeting. No comment.

KCC/0495/2018 Covers Farm Quarry, Westerham Kent. Recommendation: Tatsfield Parish Council wishes to reconfirm its previous objections which it made in response to the Covers Farm Quarry application in 2018, 2020, 2021, 2022 and 2023. The Parish council strenuously objects to this application on the basis of the harm such proposals, if approved would have on the Parish, its residents, its roads and also the surrounding areas. Recommendation: Reconfirm our objections.

Finance

The Eucalyptus tree which was overhanging the Village Hall car park has been cut back to boundary during the Easter holidays. This is to deter the bird excrement being deposited on the outside play area occupied by Little Acorns and to prevent branches possibly falling on parked cars.

Two new "No Parking" signs have been erected on the Lusted Hall Lane side of Westmore Green to discourage parking along the verges and stop erosion.

Our project to resurface and tidy the picnic area outside the shops will begin in the next week. We hope this will be ready for the better weather for all to enjoy. This will involve lighting, new waste bins and planting.

Our playground extension garden for our pre-schoolers is starting to settle in after all the rain. This has been a project which received funds from the Beer Festival team and the Roseheath Foundation to which we are very grateful. The grass has been cut and a few more plants added. CLAIRE COUTINHO MP

As Energy Secretary, I know many families in East Surrey and across the country feel that high standing charges are unfair and make it harder for them to cut down their monthly energy bills. Decisions around standing charges rest with Ofgem, so I have written to them setting out my expectation that standing charges are kept low, or reformed if necessary to make them fairer for consumers. You can read my full letter on my website.

In November the Prime Minister announced a massive injection of £8.3 billion into road resurfacing projects across England, funded by cancelling the second phase of HS2. As a condition of this funding, and to make sure money is being spent on pothole repairs, we required local councils to publish a two-year plan detailing exactly which roads will be repaired with the money. I know how frustrating poor road surfaces can be – so if you have a road near you that you would like to see resurfaced, please do report them on the SCC website.

I am a self-confessed community centre superfan. Community spaces can do wonders for our sense of belonging and our wellbeing, and I was thrilled to visit the site of the long-awaited Master Park Pavilion in Oxted recently. Following a mammoth fundraising

effort, including securing £1.86 million from Your Fund Surrey and £250,000 from the Government's Community Ownership Fund, the new community pavilion is well on its way to completion, and it was fantastic to get a sense of how community groups and sports clubs will be able to use the space when it is finished. I look forward to heading back when the Pavilion opens to the community towards the end of the year.

Finally, I'm delighted to share an update on The Friendship Project, the charity that I set up to support local community groups who tackle loneliness. With help from the Tandridge Community Fund, over £10,000 has now been distributed to seven community groups in East Surrey to support them in their crucial work. This includes £2,500 for the Woodhouse Centre in Oxted to help them redecorate their walls and replace carpets and lighting, £3,150 to the Westway Centre to build an outdoor shelter to help with socialising and gardening, and just under £2,000 for East Surrey Rural Transport Partnership to facilitate community outreach events and transport for those in need.

We all feel that life has got busier in recent years, and many of us will feel that we would rather have a bit more time to stop and get to know those around us – that's why I've now installed the first of my 'Happy to Chat' benches. With the money I've raised for my Friendship project, I'm installing these in green spaces in East Surrey to encourage people to spark a conversation with someone they might not have previously thought to say hello to. KENNETH ARTHUR BUDGEN Kenneth Budgen is a local man who has lived in the village for many years. He is a passionate champion for the area and standing as the Conservative candidate. As most of you know, although Tatsfield & Titsey remain a single member ward, there was a

proposal from the Boundary Commission to merge it with Limpsfield. This was opposed by many people who live in the Village, the Councillor at the time as well as various Conservative submissions by the County Councillors, East Surrey Conservative Association and the Conservative Group on Tandridge Council arguing for Tatsfield's unique situation and for it to remain a single member ward in keeping with the quaint peaceful nature of the Village. The benefit of keeping this ward as one member, is that the relationship between the Councillor and the residents can become closer and focus on local issues that are brought up by local people.

Production: once the ads have been received, checked and possibly resized they are inserted into a Word document, pages numbered and then PDF versions uploaded to shared Google Drive for each edition.

NIGFL'S NATURE NOTES

Let's begin with this message from Peter (Maynard) who has been adopted by a colourful and rather demanding new friend (02.04.24):

'I thought that you might be interested in this picture of our tame **Pheasant**. We have had a different pheasant in our garden each year for many years. They start off very



nervously but after a few weeks become very tame, coming running whenever I go outside, waiting for food. Generally, in March, they bring along a wife or more – we had nine one year – who also become tame. Each male looks quite different to his predecessor. This one is particularly handsome, having a very dark breast with a bright blue metallic sheen, and very pronounced ear tufts. What will next year bring, I wonder?'

Thank you for your email, Peter. Who needs pets when you have a friendly Pheasant? I didn't realise that their plumage was so varied. As you say, the one you photographed is particularly handsome. I feel sure

that he must have an extensive harem and that before long your garden will be overrun by a multitude of newly-fledged youngsters gobbling up your seed!

Sarah (Andrews) also reports a new friend. Perhaps to some not so handsome, but beauty, as they say, is in the eye of the beholder (01.04.24):

'Just thought I'd share a pic of a little surprise we found in the



woodpile over in the goat's field. [Along Goatsfield Road - rather appropriately!] We've tucked it back where we found him/her.'

A **Common toad** - how wonderful, Sarah! I come across the occasional frog whilst gardening, usually sheltering within the long, damp grass, but I've never seen a toad in Tatsfield. I wonder if other people have come across one. (If so, let us know.)

Normally, I only include notes about what's **been seen**. However, I thought it might be worthwhile considering a bird that **may be seen** in the near future. I'm talking about the

Hoopoe (see photo). This may seem in the realm of fantasy, but who would have thought we would be seeing Red Kites on a daily basis soaring above the village, say, five vears ago? John (Andrews) kindly gave me a recent newspaper article that stated: '(The Hoopoe) could be on its way to Britain thanks to climate change.' 'Scientists believe Hoopoe may set up home on British shores, with scores of sightings being reported every year.' With the prediction of hotter summer months in coming years, the possibility of this southern European migrant taking up residence here is not unreasonable. In fact, looking back to my 1981 field guide, it was already being reported that a few pairs of Hoopoes were breeding annually in southern and



eastern England. And what of its earlier history? My 1900 copy of 'The Birds of Surrey' contains four pages of sightings, beginning in 1783.A little later, in 1810, a flock of fourteen were seen on Blackheath, near Godalming. We then see numerous entries of sightings (and shootings) up to the year of publication. Of particular interest to us are the sightings in Tandridge (August 16th 1876) and Oxted (June 26th 1892). Switching to a later copy of 'Birds in Surrey' (1972) we find another reference to Oxted when four were seen in April 1949. During the years 1950 to 1970, sightings in Surrey were reported almost annually, the majority occurring during May, a good number in April and a few as early as March. In fact, there are a few records for every month from March to October. Until the 1950's the Hoopoe was regarded as a 'scarce visitor'. Nowadays, it is an 'irregular, summer visitor'. So, let's all be alert; there could be a Hoopoe or two coming your way, quite soon!

THE TATSFIFLD GARDENER IN MAY

I am sure the Tatsfield weather watchers have been keeping a sharp eye out to see which tree came into leaf first, the Ash or the Oak? The old countryman's saying "If the Ash be before the Oak, then we will have a soak, but if the Oak be before the Ash then we will have just a splash" Sometimes it is a close run thing, but this year there is no doubt, the Oak has it comfortably! So will we be having a dry summer, who knows! It does seem certain that we are entering a drier spell, as is often the case in late April and into May, but this can bring colder winds from the East and maybe a few chilly nights as well.

The mild weather has produced lot of growth and I have been putting tender seedlings outside, even leaving the out overnight. This is a sensible strategy as it ensures more sturdy, healthier growth, but it is also risky; watch the daily forecast carefully and be ready to bring these delicate plants indoors as even a light frost can do a lot of damage.

What a wonderful sight it was to see no less than seven entries in the Rhubarb section at the Spring Show, congratulations Helen on winning this section! The mild winter and high rainfall resulted in a bumper crop this year, Rhubarb is one of the most reliable crops in any weather. Did you know that it will grow very well in a container? Ideally a big one such as a wooden tub filled with a rich mix of compost and well-rotted manure is all you need. If you want a very early crop, get hold of a large (24") diameter pot and invert it over the clump in January/February and wait for the stems and leaves to emerge, this is called forcing. Forced Rhubarb has a more delicate flavour and cooks more easily, just add a little honey as it cooks. As soon as you have 'pulled' (not cut) the stems, uncover the plant so that it makes new stems and leaves.

The spring displays of wildflowers this year has been exceptional, particularly Primroses, Cowslips and Bluebells, I can also see clumps of Foxgloves just waiting to produce those tall spikes of purple, pink and white flowers. Please remember to leave the flower heads on the plant to allow them to produce seed; the seed capsules will turn brown, split open, and distribute the seed all around the area, when that is done you can remove the old flower heads — usually in June. It will take a couple of years for the tiny seedlings to grow large enough to flower so be careful when weeding around the plants!

WILDLIFF GARDFNING TIPS

WILD THING

Hi all. I hope you're all enjoying No Mow May as much as those daisies, buttercups and buzzy little pollinators are. In May last year I got persuaded by my yoga buddy George to try out something that turned out to be the most rewarding bit of gardening I've ever done, which was to dig up a modest section of lawn and turn it into a wildflower patch. There was a slow start while the seeds germinated but they quickly grew, and the flowers started to bloom in late June and carried on in a crescendo of colour right up to Christmas. There are more than 200 species of bee in the UK and many of them seemed to be queuing up at our wildflower patch along with some magnificent dragonflies that I'd never seen before. And I'm reliably informed that dragonflies are a sign of a of a truly healthy garden. That little patch of flowers seemed to attract more wildlife than the rest of the garden put together; the flowers brought the butterflies, bees and bugs, and the bugs brought the birds – there was quite an air show going on.

Digging up part of a lawn isn't the only way to grow wildflowers; they'll happily grow in tubs and borders. And there are many different seed mixes; there are bee friendly mixes with native and non-native seeds for an extended flowering season, and there are butterfly friendly blends that only have UK species because butterflies prefer plants, they are familiar with. There are even bat friendly mixes intended to attract night flying moths. This year we're going for a bee and butterfly blend though I wish we had space for the bat ones too. One last thing; wildflower seeds can be sown anytime from April to late June, so to really make the most of it I'm sowing some early and more later in June to stretch out the flowering season.

A quick word about Asian Hornets. You have probably seen or heard how these invasive predators are in Kent & Surrey and that they prey on bees, especially honeybees that have no defence against them other than us. This is very bad news for beekeepers and honey munchers alike, but it doesn't stop there, especially for gardeners and bird lovers. Hornets will strip an area of pollinators and other insects which, in turn, devastates entire eco-systems including our farms, woodlands and gardens. There is plenty of info online about their appearance and what to do about them. And if you feel like pitching in there are traps and lures you can use to help deal with them.

INTERESTING FACT OF THE MONTH Badgers are very houseproud and keep their setts well maintained. There is one well-known sett that has been occupied for over 450 years since Tudor times. One way in which they keep things hygienic is by regularly changing their bedding. Indeed, they seem to do better than us because changing bedding is a job for the youngsters while Mum is out foraging, and this time of year, their favourite bedding material is bluebells. Wouldn't it be nice if, while mums were out at work, more teenagers were home preparing a bed of bluebells?

THE NIGHT SKY IN TATSFIFLD - MAY 2024

May this year will be a frustrating time if you happen to be a planetary observer. Venus, Mercury, Mars and Saturn are all morning objects but are too close to the Sun early in the month to be found or studied with any ease. However, by month's end Saturn, and to a lesser degree Mars, are just beginning to emerge from the solar glow although neither are particularly bright. Saturn will be the easiest to find partly because it appears further from the Sun but also because a Moon just past third quarter is a few degrees to the west (right) on 31st May. The bad news, as always, is that you will need to look in the early morning, and in this case around 4am. Jupiter has also moved into the morning sky, though it is presently lost in twilight, which means that, rather unusually, on the morning of 31st all seven planets are strung out in a line between the Sun and Moon.

As the nights draw out, the period of real darkness (with no light intrusion from the Sun) becomes less and less. It is astronomically dark when the centre of the Sun has reached 18° below the horizon. By the time we get to May 25th, the Sun will not reach that far below the horizon which means that, if you ignore *civil* and *nautical* twilight in the morning and evening, we will spend the night in a state of permanent *astronomical* twilight. This flavour of twilight is in operation when the centre of the Sun lies between 12° and 18° below the horizon.

I mentioned recently that light pollution (Artificial Light at Night or ALAN for short) not only robs us of views of the night sky and Milky Way but also has seriously detrimental effects on many forms of wildlife. After all, life on Earth developed and evolved over millions of years to be the way it is thanks to the day/night cycle. Sadly, it is us humans who are disrupting this pattern with what appears to be little regard for other life forms.

Something like 97% of animals are invertebrates and of these around two thirds are either entirely or partially nocturnal, so we are unlikely to see most of them and therefore be unaware of how our actions impact them. More than half of insects are nocturnal with estimates suggesting that of all those that get attracted to artificial lights, around a third are killed as a result. This can be due to exhaustion, predation, and a degraded ability to correctly navigate. The wholly vain and unnecessary fashion for floodlighting of gardens impacts those species that are pollinating, pest controlling and indeed providing food for other animals at night. A 2019 report titled *Light Pollution is a Driver of Insect Declines* brings together some 200 independent studies and provides evidence of what the journal *Biological Conservation* calls an "Insect Apocalypse". However, it has to be said, some predators benefit from increased night-time lighting whilst those that rely on darkness for their survival can be negatively affected.

The way that some species of birds and mammals, that are active during daylight hours, behave in artificially lit areas can cause them to become stressed which, in turn, leads to reduced breeding success. Trials on a variety of birds found that those who experienced artificial light gained body mass more slowly and reached their first mating later than those who were kept in dark conditions through the night. It was found that in some

areas bat roosts either reduced or disappeared when nearby buildings were floodlit. It was noted that they tended to emerge to feed later because the day had artificially increased.

Further afield, some turtles that require moonless nights to hatch and make their way to the relative safety of the sea are turning inland towards bright artificial lights becoming easy prey for predators.

In future issues I'll look at some other impacts on us and our environment and ecosystem.

TATSFIELD A CENTURY AGO



Property sale puzzle – In the middle of May 1924, the Westerham Herald carried an advertisement for the auction of two acres of *'Freehold Garden Ground and Building Land'* at Hawthorndene on

Ricketts Hill road. Various buildings on the land included 'a large shed with two rooms and loft over' with a full-sized tennis lawn alongside. The sale was by order of the executrix of the late Charles Wiley Middleton. This seemingly routine item has turned out to be one of these 'one thing leads to another' stories you can come across when delving into local history, for there's no mention of Hawthorndene in the 1921 census.

The Middleton family was however recorded in 1921 as living at Hazeldene (next to the present-day Hawthorndene), but Charles Wiley was not amongst them. Also in 1921, a retired farmer, Charles Middleton, was boarding at Normandale in Paynesfield Road. The following year a C.W.Middleton is listed in a directory published by a local printing firm

as a market gardener linked to tennis court lettings on Ricketts Hill road. Is he one and the same? He certainly seems to be one of the family, since the Westerham Herald

Middleton, C. W., market gardener, Ricketts hill, tennis court to let by hour or day

had reported in 1909 that he was the donor of a set of carvers on the occasion of the wedding of Emma, daughter of William Clarence Middleton of Hawthorndene.

An angry parish council — At May's parish council meeting, the state of Tatsfield's roads was once again on the agenda. This time it was damage allegedly caused by extra traffic arising from an auction at a property on Ricketts Hill Road. The auctioneers' response was blunt. They thought their clients could not be blamed. "The estate was a very poor one, and the fact of the roadway being so narrow might have suited pony traps in the past but was certainly impossible with present-day traffic."

The general mood of the meeting was grumpy. The Post Office had laid cables across Westmore green without asking permission, there was disagreement with the district council over improving visibility at Church Hill corner and there was discontent over the county council increasing the rates while proposing to spend £18,000 on a 'by-pass road from Woldingham to Limpsfield'. The parish council agreed to send a strong protest against the proposal.

Tatsfield looks for staff in Yorkshire – At the end of the month there was a vacancy at The Grange – later to become Beaconshaw. Miss K. Pritchard decided to advertise in the Sheffield Daily Telegraph for a 'house-parlour maid' who was capable and willing to serve a family of three in a 'comfortable, regular situation'.
