





#### TATSFIELD MASK MAKERS UPDATE

During the first COVID lockdown in 2020 three sewists in Tatsfield made over a thousand masks for residents, family and friends. Distributed from Sheree's Store, the project raised almost £2,400.

The funds raised have been used around the village. The main event was providing a free picnic to almost 400 individuals at the Summer Picnic on the Green in August 2021. Monies were also used to purchase a bench for Sheree's Stores, donations to both the Not So Young club and the WI to hold tea parties when they were able to meet again, replacement of some of the faulty Christmas lights in the village centre, and the planting of a memorial flowering Cherry Tree on Westmore Green and plaque; the tree is just flowering for the first time and will do so in Spring every year, as a reminder of the efforts made by the whole village during the pandemic.

#### TATSFIFLD PARISH COUNCIL

A rather small meeting was held on 11<sup>th</sup> April with only three Parish Councillors attending due to holidays.

#### **Police**

We started the meeting with a very welcome visit from PC Christian Mansfield and PCSO Amy Ord. They provided a report on activity in the area, the school car park was the main area of reports regarding ASB and they had received multiple calls regarding drug use and criminal damage. The police are now making regular visits to the car park and request that we all continue to report. This can be done via 101, through the online reporting form or on Facebook on the Tandridge Beat page. As much detail as possible when reporting is helpful - registration numbers, make, model and colour of vehicles. The PC hope this visit is the first of many to our monthly meetings.

#### **Planning**

TA/2022/192 84 Paynesfield Road Removal of existing roof, construction of new first floor and roof extension. Demolition of attached garage, construction of new attached garage with storage mezzanine. Replacement of entrance porch. New bay window to study. Construction of projecting bay to Reception room with sliding doors and balcony to first floor Master Bedroom. Install dormer windows to rear first floor bedrooms. Internal alterations to increase kitchen and Hallway. New rendered wall finishes throughout ground floor. New hanging clay tiles to first floor and new clay tiled roof finish. New windows and doors throughout. Construct double carport and associated driveway paving, patio paving with steps and planters. Construct new pool room.

**Comment-** The Property is in the Village settlement. The Parish Council does not object to the proposals in relation to the house but does object to erect a double height garage. The PC would question why the applicants are increasing the height of garage and adding windows and rooflights. Members feel the height of the garage would overshadow on the neighbour's garden to the west in the mornings.

**TA/2022/66 The Firs, Maesmaur Road** Erection of detached garage. Plans show what appears to be a 2-storey double garage with windows and side door. The property is outside the Village Settlement area and within the Green Belt. Plans show a disproportionate size of garage to the house.

**Comment-** Objection. The Parish Council objects to this application on the grounds of size and Location in the Green Belt.

**TA/2022/241 Tarnhelm, Ricketts Hill Road** Erection of a single storey side and rear extension. Conversion of roof space with first floor dormer extension to rear elevation. (Application for a certificate of Lawful Development for a proposed use or Development) **Comment-** Objection. Property is outside the Village settlement in the Green Belt. Plans are not fully available. The proposal more than doubles the size of the house. It is

therefore a disproportionate addition to the existing dwelling and therefore by definition cause harm to the Green Belt.

**TA 2021/697 1 Parkside Cottages, Rag Hill Road** Erection of two-storey side extension, single storey rear extension and front extension – revised plans.

**Comment**- This application is for revised plans from an application made in 2021. No further comments.

**TA/2022/380 Saddlers, 85 Paynesfield Road** Erection of single storey rear extension, New enclosed Porch, Conversion of detached garage into gym/family entertainment space ancillary to main dwelling, changes to fenestration including installation of Bi-Fold doors. This property is in the village settlement area. The changes are small in proportion to the existing property and will have little or no impact on neighbouring properties. **Comment-** No Comment.

#### TANDRIDGE DISTRICT COUNCIL

As there are elections on the horizon the last month has been extremely quiet on the District Council front so nothing from me, but you may find the following interesting and informative, so please read this carefully.

#### Would you like to be a councillor?

There will be District Council elections in Tandridge but **NOT Tatsfield** this year. Next year will be my eighth and final year and I will be up for re-election. So, as I have done previously, I wanted to give anyone who may be interested in taking on the role of the District Councillor for Tatsfield and Titsey the opportunity to come forward in plenty of time and find out about the role. **If that is you then please contact me on the details below.** 

#### This year's elections

The 14 seats up for re-election this time see some surprising names not standing for reelection. Tony Elias Leader of the Conservatives and Geoff Duck both long time members along with Simon Morrow a Liberal Democrat amongst the most notable. Kevin Bourne I&OLRG my last year's Chairman of the Audit and Scrutiny is standing down and he will be a big loss as his tenacity on the numbers was second to none. So, it is unlikely that the elections will change the "no overall control" of the Council but there is the possibility that the leadership could change from I&OLRG back the Conservatives. All very interesting.

#### Your council tax energy rebate

Properties in **council tax bands A to D** may be eligible for a <u>council tax energy rebate</u>.

If you **pay by direct debit**, in most cases, the rebate will go directly into your bank account by mid-May. If you don't <u>pay your council tax by direct debit</u> already, you can quickly and <u>easily set it up</u>.

More financial support may soon be available for households not eligible for the rebate. We'll let you know more as soon as we receive guidance from the government.

#### Living safely with respiratory infections including Covid-19

As we learn to live safely with Covid-19, there are things we can all do to help reduce the risk of catching it and passing it on to others. This will also help to reduce the spread of other respiratory infections, such as colds and flu, which can spread easily and may cause serious illness in some people.

To help reduce the spread of Covid-19 and other respiratory infections and protect those at highest risk, please:

- Get a Covid-19 vaccine if you haven't had one.
- Open the windows and let fresh air inside.
- Practise good hygiene, by washing your hands, cover your coughs and sneezes and clean your surroundings often.

- Wear a face covering as this can help reduce the chance of spreading infection to others.
- Consider taking a lateral flow test. You can buy these from pharmacies and supermarkets, in store and online.

If you have symptoms of a respiratory infection, please consider staying at home and avoiding contact with other people.

We will undertake this at our next meetings on the Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup>



April and then Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> (or 25<sup>th</sup>) of May. If you wanted to assist us with this there is still time for you to have your input.

Chocolate has a Name - Teaching children in West Africa how to make chocolate



Today, around 70% of the world's chocolate is made from beans grown in West Africa, mostly Ghana and Cote d'Ivoire. How did this happen when the cacao or cocoa plant is not even indigenous to the region?

Cacao was first cultivated over 4000 years ago by the Olmec and Mayan peoples who lived in what is now Mexico, Belize, El Salvador, and Honduras. They ground the beans into a paste and made a bitter drink, often flavoured with spices. The Spanish introduced this chocolate drink to Europe in the 16<sup>th</sup> century. After the addition of sugar, the drink became so popular that Spain set up cocoa plantations in their colonies in the West Indies. The English, French and Dutch soon followed suit and established plantations in their colonies too. In the mid 19<sup>th</sup> century, the Quaker chocolate dynasty, Fry & Sons, developed a way to mix cocoa powder with sugar and cocoa butter to produce a smooth paste that could be poured into a mould, the first chocolate bar. It was at this point that the British and French introduced large scale cocoa production to their colonies in West Africa. Ghana (then known as the Gold Coast) for the British and Cote d'Ivoire (Ivory Coast) for the French. There was a plentiful supply of cheap labour and land and the right tropical weather and soil conditions for cocoa to thrive.

Today, cocoa is so vital to the Ghanaian economy that it features on bank notes and coins, however, the average cocoa farmer earns just 74p a day while the living wage is around £2.30. This means that cocoa farmers can't afford necessities like medical care, decent food and education. The average age of a cocoa farmers is 50 and many of their

children don't see a future in cocoa farming because it's very hard work, for very little reward added to this the climate crisis is having a significant effect on yield.

Most cocoa farmers cultivate and harvest cocoa pods, dry the beans and bag them up for export without ever tasting the delicious chocolate that results from their labours. They don't see the crops as belonging to them - it belongs to the buyers; the multinational corporations who make billions from the chocolate trade. In 2021 the global chocolate industry was worth an estimated \$106 billion!

But while traditional West African recipes don't contain cocoa there are some chocolate makers in West Africa who are using locally grown cocoa beans and sugar to create chocolate. One of these, Dekocraft is based in Accra and they have a programme delivering chocolate making workshops to children and adults in the affluent areas of the city. Now they have a plan to train teachers in the impoverished cocoa growing areas to deliver these workshops as part of the general curriculum. They want the girls who grow up around cocoa farms to have a sense of pride and ownership; to help them see a future in chocolate, and to understand the nutritional potential of using cocoa in their cooking and as a breakfast drink.

#### The Chocolate Has a Name pilot was launched during Fairtrade Fortnight:

The good news is that Tony's Chocolonely is looking at this pilot with a view to rolling it out to the schools they work with in the region.

There will be an opportunity for you to donate to this project at our Tea Tent at the Village celebration for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee on Sunday, 5<sup>th</sup> June.

#### **NIGFL'S NATURE NOTES**

Bramblings are everywhere! Well, perhaps not everywhere, but certainly along the entire length of Greenway and across to Paynesfield and John's Road. I've seen six in my neighbour's garden (John and Val Moore) and Tony (Turner), who lives at the bottom of the road, has seen the same sort of number. The question is – are these the same birds flying up and down the road or are they separate groups? What will be of particular interest now is to see when they disappear. You may remember that I mentioned last month that Bramblings are winter migrants. This means that they should be flying off to their summer home around the end of April. However, I also mentioned that a few are deciding to stick around rather than make the long flight back to Scandinavia. Interestingly, Meyer, who quotes Mr. Lewcock (of Farnham), gives a long account of a supposed pair of these birds which bred in his garden in May of 1843, but the account is now regarded as wholly unsatisfactory, though Meyer quotes other instances in which he believes the species was seen by him during the summer months. ('The Birds of Surrey', John Bucknill, 1900.) First Brimstone – 1st January. Last Brambling -?

We have a new contributor! Michelle Hitchcock is concerned about the **clearance of land during the nesting season** (16.04.22):

'I was walking in Park wood yesterday and, as a nature lover, was very upset to see that the scrubby area next to the golf course has been completely cut down. There must have been bird nests in the bramble and bushes, not to mention other wildlife. I thought it was illegal to carry out such work from April to September and would appreciate your thoughts.'

Okay, Michelle, this is briefly the situation as I understand it: Anyone (apart from subsidised farmers), can fell a tree or cut or clear a hedgerow at any time of the year. However, Section I of the Wildlife and Countryside Act, 1981 states:

'If any person intentionally: kills, injures or takes any wild bird; takes, damages or destroys the nest of a wild bird; takes, damages or destroys the nest of any wild bird while that nest is in use or being built; or takes or destroys an egg of any wild bird; he shall be guilty of an offence.'

Sounds straightforward enough. I suggest, however, that the gathering of evidence against a perpetrator would prove exceptionally difficult.

Farmers have their own rules. Those who benefit from the Basic Payment Scheme are not allowed to cut trees or hedges between 1<sup>st</sup> March and 31<sup>st</sup> August. Failure to comply with the rules could result in a hefty cross compliance penalty. There are, however, various exceptions that relate to public access and safety issues, such as the felling of disease-ridden Ash trees and the clearance of roadways and footpaths.

#### THE NIGHT SKY IN TATSFIFLD – MAY 2022

Many astronomical phenomena require at least minimal optical aid in order to see them. However, a lunar eclipse is fortunately not one of them and on May 16<sup>th</sup> we get to see that very spectacle.


An eclipse of the Moon occurs when the Sun, Earth and Moon form up in a straight line with the Earth in the middle. When that happens the Moon, travelling around us in its orbit, moves into the shadow of the Earth that is always cast out into space.

The good news about this event is that it is a total eclipse so the whole disk of the Moon will move into the Earth's shadow and also, we should see our nearest neighbour in space turn a coppery-red colour. The bad news is that the eclipse begins at 3:28am and continues until the Moon sets at 5:08am by which time it is fully eclipsed.

The event proper begins at 2:32am when the Moon enters the Earth's outer shadow, called the penumbra. You won't be able to spot this because the change in brightness is extremely subtle so go outside at 3:28am which is when our satellite starts to move into the darker central portion of the shadow known as the umbra. Once that begins to happen the top left portion of the Moon (at about 10 on a clock face) will start to look rather as if a chunk has been taken out of it. This portion becomes larger as progressively more and more of the Moon moves into the shadow until at 4:29am it is fully enveloped. It is around this time that you should be able to tell that it has changed colour as I mentioned above. The weather, of course, is one variable but another is the state of the atmosphere at the time which can affect our view in two ways.

Firstly, when any astronomical body is very close to the horizon, we are viewing it through a much thicker layer of the atmosphere, compared to if it were overhead, which can have an effect on its appearance. Secondly, we need to consider why the Moon appears reddish and why it is visible at all during an eclipse. It would seem sensible to

assume that once the Moon is fully within the Earth's shadow it would be invisible but this is not the case. What happens (as



shown by the red dashed lines in the diagram) is that the light from the Sun enters the Earth's atmosphere and is refracted (bent) in the same way that light is bent when it passes through a lens. Because blue light has a shorter wavelength it is scattered by gas molecules in the air whilst the red light, of longer wavelength is scattered much less and makes it through to reach the Moon. This effect, known as Rayleigh scattering in honour of Lord Rayleigh who discovered it, also explains why the sky appears to be blue. However, because we can only see the Moon due to light passing through the Earth's atmosphere its colour and brightness can be affected if there have been sizeable volcanic eruptions prior to an eclipse.

Plans are now in place for the summer planting to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. Purple, yellow and white petunias are being delivered by Coblands in the week beginning 16<sup>th</sup> May with





planting to be carried out during that week so that the plants can get established before the Jubilee weekend at the beginning of June. We will be using the same procedures that we have used in recent years which will entail offering to clear and replant one or more containers, mangers or baskets with compost, fertilising granules and plants from the Allotment Site.

If you would like to help us with this work, please let me know. A watering rota is also being drawn up for the summer and we hope that as many people as possible will volunteer to take on this task.

You may have seen that the Tatol Bed is looking a little different now. We have decided to try to make our plants more sustainable so, instead of using only bedding plants in the

Tatol Bed and in the Memorial Trough, we have planted some low shrubs which will form the centrepiece with summer bedding plants added for colour. If this experiment is successful, we will extend this to other containers, etc in the future.

We are also purchasing some perennials and shrubs to make a new bed under the new parish noticeboard on Westmore Green. In addition, the circular bed on the



Bakery Lawn has been turfed over to make way for the fire basket which will be lit at 9.45pm on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> June to celebrate the Jubilee.

One of our Tatsfield in Bloom volunteers mowed the grass outside the Bakery for the first time during April. Unfortunately it seems that this area has now become the local dog toilet. Please help us to keep Tatsfield looking great and pick up your dog poo! If you see someone with a dog pooing on our grass, and not picking it up, take a photo and post it on Tatsfield Talk - name and shame!"

### TATSFIFLD A CENTURY AGO

It was at the start of this year that details of the 1921 census were released. As well as giving us a detailed account of the social structure of this country, it is also a major source of information



for people researching their family history. Sadly, the charge for downloading images has deterred many people, but there is an alternative — a trip to the National Archives in Kew, where access to images of the original records is easy, free of charge and in comfortable surroundings.



I have started looking at the details of the 223 properties then in Tatsfield, in the hope of putting them on display at next month's 'History Weekend' in the Aileen McHugo Building'.

Tatsfield's population in 1921 was less than half its present figure. A first look at the age structure reveals that there were then more children under 14 - 30% of the population - than there are now - below 20%. In 1921, 10% of villagers were over 65. Now that proportion has more than doubled.

I then looked at surnames. The most common in 1921 was Standing, with 26 people sharing that name. Higgs came next with 21, followed by Watson with 17. Another half a dozen surnames - Burbage, Hitchcock, Lugton, Potter, Shrubb or Streets – were each shared by at least ten Tatsfielders.

Houses tend to be re-named over the years, but according to my research so far, about half of them still have the name they had then.

It will be another thirty years before details of another census – for 1951 – are due to be made public. The 1931 census returns were destroyed in a disastrous fire at the warehouse where they were being stored and the Second World War prevented the holding of a census in 1941. A National Registration system was established in 1939, but not all the details have yet been released to the public.

So the 1921 census, with more details than its predecessors, will keep local and family historians busy for months to come. The returns not only give basic details of each person, their relationship to the 'head' of the household etc, and their occupation, but also where and for whom they worked, telling us much more about the social fabric of Tatsfield at the time.

As an example, we can see that of the 832 people recorded, 140 were born in Tatsfield or neighbouring parishes. More than 200 gave London as their place of birth. Eleven from several families were born in Somerset; six – also from several families – originated from Suffolk.

Farming and building were the major sources of employment – all locally. A couple of dozen residents were recorded as being domestic servants. Other occupations which come to notice are one actress, and one professional artist. Forty or more Tatsfielders had jobs in different parts of London.

If all goes well, you will be able to see this for yourself next month if you come to the 'History Weekend' at the Aileen McHugo Building on June 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>.

### THE TATSFIELD GARDENER IN MAY

The Tatsfield in Bloom team will be planting out the village flower displays early this year so that the displays are looking good for the Queens Jubilee weekend in June — we need more volunteers!! Please contact Jill Hancock if you can spare an hour to help plant up the containers.

Planting out tender summer flowering plants in mid-May has its risks especially as these plants are produced under cover these days, there is still a slight risk of a ground frost. If you are producing your own flowers and vegetables make sure to follow traditional gardening practice of 'hardening the off' before planting them out. This practice involves putting them out of the greenhouse/tunnel for a week or two before planting, if the forecast is for a chilly night, then cover them in a light sheet or horticultural fleece (not the jumper!) – something light that will not crush the young foliage.

It is a great idea to start your beans and peas in pots or trays to give them a good start and earlier crops – but – if they are planted directly from the greenhouse, and there are chilly nights and cold winds, they will suffer a big shock and stop growing. Speaking of runner beans, remember to put a seed in the ground next to the plants as you plant them to give continuity.

I was asked a question recently about how to cope with a Clematis montana that was threatening to bring down some fence panels it had grown so big. This is the vigorous Clematis that is flowering now with a mass of small white or pink flowers. When it has finished flowering it will make a mass of new growth ready for early flowering next year. Now is the time to cut it all off the fence, this not a job for careful nipping here and there with secateurs, this is a job for a saw and loppers! Cut it down to about a metre above the ground, yes that means producing a lot of growth so you will need plenty of bags – the good news is that when shredded it makes excellent compost; take it to the community composting site. As it produces lots of new shoots you will need to tie them in – growing it up a trellis can save a lot of time tying in shoots. A very important point – please make sure to carry out a thorough examination of the whole area to check for birds' nests. Blackbirds, Robins and many other species love to nest in Clematis as it provides them with dense cover and protect from marauders! If you find an active nest, please wait until the fledglings have flown away.

### NORTH DOWNS SINFONIA

Our next concert is at 7.30pm on Saturday May 7<sup>th</sup>. It will consist of Beethoven Piano Concerto No 5 (the Emperor) with our favourite soloist, Mariela Cingo, who has played with the orchestra many times before, together with the Mozart Symphony 31 (Paris) and William Sterndale Bennett's The Naiads Overture. This is a work which is rarely played, by an English composer (1816 to 1875) of whom many have never heard. Nevertheless, it is an extremely melodic piece, and very enjoyable to listen to. Bennett was much admired by Schumann, with whom he was friends, and indeed Schumann dedicated some of his works to Bennett. However, he did not compose much, as he had several demanding executive duties, including being a Professor of Music at Cambridge University, and Principal of the Royal Academy of Music. The Beethoven is of course very well known — his final, and possibly best, piano concerto. The Mozart symphony was composed in 1778 (he was still only 22, but had already composed 30 symphonies!) and was first performed in Paris, from which it took it's name.

The concert will be conducted by Ben Knowles. Ben is a young conductor who has never conducted the orchestra in a concert before, but it promises to be an extremely enjoyable concert, and we look forward to seeing you there.






