



Tatsfield Parish Council is working alongside Sheree's Store and the Post Office in Tatsfield to ensure anyone having to self-isolate within our community will be able to receive food and supplies during this difficult time.

**Latest Information:** The latest information from Public Health England on Coronavirus or COVID-19 can be found on the **Public Health England** website.

**Sheree's Store**: Sheree and her team will make up food packages and get them delivered to your door 7 days a week. You can phone the shop on **01959 928181** or phone/message Sheree direct on **07727 418968** with your orders. Sheree and Simon are keeping the store fully stocked with bread, milk, tinned food, paracetamol and other basic medicines, toilet rolls, soaps, newspapers and all your basic needs. They take payments over the phone so no need to panic about needing cash available.

**Post Office:** If you have a parcel or Letter delivered to the Post Office which you cannot collect, please phone them on **01959 575549** and they will arrange to get it delivered to your door.

Prescription collection and delivery service: Contact Kim Jennings 01959 577328 / 07951072326

**Check your neighbours:** Could we please ask the residents of Tatsfield to look out for each other during these difficult times. If you have a neighbour who lives alone, please check on them or make the Parish Council or Sheree aware so we can get in contact and provide assistance.

Facebook: We will post regular updates on the local Facebook group Tatsfield Talk.

#### TANDRIDGE DISTRICT COUNCIL

It has obviously been a quiet month for me since the last report to the April magazine. I keep turning pages over in my diary only to write "cancelled" or "postponed" against the entries that were written in months ago.

However, that seems unimportant within the current climate of the pandemic that is affecting us all and I hope everyone, and their extended families, remain safe and well. It is good to have seen us all taking the proper precautions and to see everyone so friendly whilst taking their exercise around the village. And if you are anything like me and have a garden, I presume you have been catching up with the weeding and making all in the garden neat and tidy.

You may be interested to know that the order not to congregate caused every Council (Parish, District, County and Parliament) to have a problem as they were unable to hold meetings, it took our Government some time to pass a law that would allow that to happen. At the time of writing this report there will not be a "remote" Council meeting until the 14<sup>th</sup> May when the Officers and Councillors will get back to the running of the District Council.

In the meantime, the officers have been assisting those most in need whilst also running the business of the council part of which has been to be part of the Surrey Local Resilience Forum which includes other Surrey councils, the emergency services, health and utilities. In the event of a specific incident we work together to provide a multiagency response. That forum is currently being used to provide mutual support and guidance.

Apply now for the Small Business Grant Fund or Retail, Hospitality and Leisure Grants

If you are eligible for a business grant under one of the government's new schemes, please complete the application form on the TDC website, you will need your Business Rate account number, shown on your bill. Once we have your application, we will check it and contact you to let you know the outcome.

New bills are also being sent out this week to all businesses eligible to receive 100% business rates relief. If the April payment has already been paid, we will refund any overpaid monies, if you are eligible, as soon as is practicably possible.

I have been surprised at how many TDC related questions appear on Facebook and Tatsfield Talk, all good for communication amongst villagers but if you were to sign up to the TDC e-newsletters you can receive all of this information and updates direct to your email. It includes news and events, recycling and rubbish, a business newsletter, Local Plan and planning. You can sign up to this by visiting <u>www.tandridge.gov.uk/mag</u>.

The promised April programme regarding the change of "size of waste bins" will obviously be delayed so you should take this time and opportunity to start to increase your recycling, not only will this help the environment and the Council's finances but it will save you money as additional recycling bins are free, but waste bins will cost you.

#### Bulky rubbish clearance weekend 25 April cancelled

To follow the current social distancing guidance and to minimise any risk to our staff and residents, other weekends are scheduled for May and we will make any decision to cancel these nearer the time. Sign up to stay informed.

#### Community recycling centres are closed

The community recycling centres in Caterham on the Hill, Warlingham and the Earlswood depot have closed until further notice. Please store at home any items you would normally take to a centre until they re-open, please don't put them in your bins. The skip hire companies are still operating if you are having a much larger clear out or starting on some DIY.

I am still dealing with reports of multiple "overflying" which I am checking and will pursue with the CEO/BHA.

#### **RECYCLING AND RUBBISH COLLECTION UPDATES**

From Tuesday 21 April your recycling and rubbish will be collected on your normal day.

There may be delays to the service because:

- There is an increase in the amount of waste being collected in the district.
- There are more parked cars which can block access to roads or make it difficult for the vehicles to manoeuver.
- Staff absence due to sickness may affect or temporarily suspend the service.
- If your bin has not been emptied, please leave it at the edge of your property until it has been.

#### YOU MAKE A HUGE DIFFERENCE BY RECYCLING YOUR FOOD WASTE

With more people at home, the amount of food waste being collected in the green food caddies has increased. This increase will help protect the environment as it doesn't end

up in landfill and leaves more space in the council issued wheeled rubbish bin for items which cannot be recycled.

The food waste we collect from your green caddy is recycled into fertiliser and used to create green electricity, rather than going to landfill, where it can create methane, a harmful greenhouse gas, which damages our atmosphere.

The food waste also costs us less to recycle than your general rubbish, so by putting your food waste in the green caddy you are helping us make savings and protecting the environment.

Please don't buy more food than you need particularly during the pandemic and remember to freeze it, if you can't eat it before the use by date. Use up leftovers rather than throwing them away. Check the recipe page for ideas.

If you need another green caddy because you are producing more food waste at home complete this form, or you may like to consider turning your kitchen and garden waste into compost, for more information visit www.getcomposting.com.

#### THANK YOU FOR YOUR COMMITMENT TO RECYCLING

As well as our increase in food recycling, we have also seen an increase in the amount of recycling collected. To maximise space in your blue lidded recycling bins, please compact your recycling as much as possible and only put items which can be recycled in the bin. Use the Surrey Recycles search tool to find out what goes where.

You can place additional recycling in carrier bags, or cardboard boxes or clear recycling sacks next to your recycling bin. Please don't use black sacks, as the collection crew needs to be able to see that it is actually recycling.

If you often fill up your blue lidded recycling bin, you can order a second or third bin by completing this form. Since the lockdown started last month, we have delivered over 170 recycling bins and 190 green food caddies to homes.

If you can, please reduce the amount of waste you produce. Could you use an alternative reusable item, or use something again instead of throwing it away? Read these tips on how to reduce the amount of waste.

#### DON'T FLYTIP YOUR WASTE

Over the Easter bank holiday weekend, we saw an increase in flytipping in the district. We appreciate options for disposing of your waste are reduced now, but please don't be tempted to dispose of your waste elsewhere in the district.

Flytipping is against the law and those convicted face fines of up to £50,000 or up to five years' imprisonment, as well as other potential penalties.

If you cannot store your waste until the community recycling centres open and you want to hire a private waste collection company, please check they are a registered carrier and get a copy of the disposal ticket. To see if a company is registered visit the Environment Agency's public register or call 03708 506 506. If you hire a non-registered carrier and they flytip your waste, you can still be prosecuted and fined.

If you are concerned a company isn't disposing of waste correctly, call the Environment Agency on 0800 80 70 60 or report it to Crimestoppers.

Skip hire companies are still operating if you are having a much larger clear out or starting on some DIY.

#### **NO BONFIRES**

Some residents are still regularly burning their waste. We are asking everyone to stop and think about their neighbours. Please don't have a bonfire.

Bonfires create smoke, cause air pollution and prevent people from being in their gardens and can have a bigger impact at this time.

Coronavirus is known to cause serious respiratory problems, which could be made much worse if the sufferer is exposed to smoke from bonfires.

Bonfires can also become out of control or cause accidents, creating extra pressure on the already busy emergency services.

Please think of others, compost your garden waste where possible and store your rubbish for disposal when the current emergency is over, rather than burn it.

#### **NO FIREWORKS**

Every Thursday at 8pm many residents are standing on their doorsteps and joining together with the nation by clapping their support for the valuable work the NHS is doing.

Some residents are also setting off fireworks or releasing sky lanterns at this time. Fireworks can frighten people and animals so please consider your neighbours who are likely to be at home during the lockdown.

Fireworks and sky lanterns also emit harmful polluting toxins and particles into the air which can damage the environment. These toxins could make it harder for people to breathe if they have serious respiratory problems, such as the coronavirus.

Like bonfires, if you are injured by a firework, it can put additional pressure on our NHS.

If you do have fireworks, please don't out them in your bin as they may not be finished and could cause a fire in the bin or the bin lorry. Instead, soak them overnight in a bucket of water and take them to a community recycling centre when they reopen.

To show your support for the NHS, please consider clapping and cheering, using kitchen equipment such as pots, pans and wooden spoons.

#### CHANGES TO CAR PARKING ARRANGEMENTS

Car parking charges in all council owned car parks across the district are suspended until 30 June, to help those who need to make essential journeys. We will keep this under review in line with the government's <u>social isolation restrictions</u>.

We are contacting all permit holders and putting up signs in our car parks to confirm the arrangements.

Although our car parks remain open, we encourage residents to follow the government's advice and stay at home during this pandemic.

Please continue to park legally and responsibly throughout the district.

#### URGENT APPEAL FOR PERSONAL PROTECIVE EQUIPMENT

Surrey County Council is appealing to businesses to provide vital personal protective equipment (PPE) supplies to help protect frontline workers deliver essential services to vulnerable Surrey residents during the Covid-19 pandemic.

As the nation faces unprecedented demand for PPE, there is a very limited supply coming into the county for social workers, care home staff, firefighters and volunteers, with the NHS understandably being prioritised.

Businesses such as tattoo artists, beauty salons, nail bars and others using these products daily can help by offering stocks while they are closed. Donations would be gratefully received as soon as possible:

Donations can be made by contacting <u>ppe.donations@surreycc.gov.uk</u>. Delivery and collection can be arranged. All items need to conform to the safety standards highlighted above and any suppliers who manufacture PPE are also encouraged to contact Surrey County Council.

#### FOOD AVAILABLE FOR PARENTS STRUGGLING TO PROVIDE FAMILY MEALS

Surrey parents struggling to provide meals for their children during the coronavirus pandemic are being urged to seek help to access the food that they need.

Easter and the school holidays, alongside the ongoing challenges of the coronavirus pandemic, are likely to bring added pressure for many families. Those finding it hard to put food on the table are being encouraged to talk to their child's school or early years setting, or to contact the <u>Community Helpline</u> set up by Surrey County Council to find out about the options available.

Children who usually receive free school meals due to benefit entitlement are able to continue to receive food even if they aren't going to school at the moment. In some cases, meals have been replaced by food packages or £15 vouchers to spend in supermarkets, and these are being distributed to families by schools.

There are various other sources of food available, including food banks and community fridges. In addition, food hampers are available for some families who need them and again schools will be able to help with allocation.

#### DOMESTIC ABUSE

The <u>Surrey Domestic Abuse Partnership</u> is aware the measures to reduce the spread of Covid-19 will put survivors of domestic abuse at further risk. Being unable to leave the home will make accessing support even more difficult and being isolated at home with a perpetrator increases the risk of serious harm or worse. The Home Office has published <u>advice and guidance for those who are experiencing or feel at risk of domestic abuse</u> during the outbreak.

#### IN DANGER, NEED THE POLICE, BUT CAN'T SPEAK?

<u>SILENT SOLUTION</u> is a way for the public to access help in an emergency situation even if it's not safe, or they are unable to speak. This solution allows someone to make themselves heard and let the 999 operator know the call is genuine.

#### **BRIGHT SKY APP**

Bright Sky is an App providing support and information for anyone experiencing domestic abuse, or someone concerned about a friend or family member. In addition, the app is available for use by employers and service providers and includes:

- A UK-wide directory of specialist domestic abuse support services
- A secure My Journal tool to record incidents of abuse via text, audio, video or photo form, without any of the content being saved on the device itself
- Questionnaires to assess the safety of a relationship, plus a section on dispelling myths around domestic and sexual abuse
- Links to further resources and information on topics around domestic abuse

# POLICING

Hi Tatsfield. Well, where does one start at a time like no other? Police work still needs doing, so we're still around the village. You would naturally think that something from regular times, like crime, would just stop happening when everything regular stops. Well, sadly not. During March, a resident's 4x4 vehicle had its spare wheel stolen from it, damaging the vehicle in the process. This happened in Parkwood Road overnight, so sadly there were no lines of enquiry to investigate. At the end of March, a resident of Westmore Green discovered one of their property windows had been smashed causing a clear hole, suggesting an air rifle or catapult had been used from a distance. Nothing was heard or seen at the time, so without a defined timeframe, we had no leads. Finally, in early April a Tatsfield resident was returning home on motorbike and stopped on Ricketts Hill Road late at night. He was approached by two males who attempted to take the bike. The victim punched one of them, before escaping from the scene. Without an accurate description of the males or any CCTV or witnesses, the case had to be filed.

**CORONAVIRUS.** Needless to say, but here it is: Current Government Guidance is to **STAY AT HOME**. Here below are the details:

1) Only go outside for food, health reasons or work (only if you cannot work from home).

2) If you go out, stay 2 metres (6ft) away from other people at all times.

3) Wash your hands as soon as you get home.

4) **Do not** meet others, even friends or family. You can spread the virus even if you don't have symptoms.

Whilst we appreciate that there is a desire to head out to some of the beautiful spots around the county, please consider the impact that doing so may have. Government advice has been given to reduce the potential of spreading Covid-19; by attending places where others also congregate, the risk of spread is increased. # **BIGGIN HILL AIRPORT UPDATE**

I write to bring you and in turn your residents up to date on the operational situation here at Biggin Hill Airport.

As you may have seen on our social media we remain open in support of the national transport infrastructure in line with government guidelines. I have instructed that only essential flight be permitted to depart or arrive, and these essential movements fall into a number of categories:

- Repatriation. This applies to both passengers and the crews that operate the aircraft, this applies to both incoming and departing passengers and crew.
- Delivery of medical and other essential supplies.
- Essential Business Flights. For instance, a group of engineers supporting ventilator production departed from Biggin Hill this week.
- Licence currency flights. All pilots are required under CAA regulations to revalidate their licences on a regular basis should they not be flying frequently. These flights are restricted to professional pilots only.
- Renewal of Certificate of Airworthiness. A certificate of airworthiness is an internationally recognised document, which confirms that the airworthiness of the aircraft. Only aircraft used for commercial operations will be permitted to undertake a flight to renew the certificate.

To ensure that such flights are essential, all flights are required to submit an approved flight plan or book in using the PPR (Prior Permission Required) system, specifying the purpose of the flight and receiving Air Traffic Control approval.

The Executive Team and Heads of Department's conduct daily COVID – 19 conferencing so that we can formulate and adapt policies, practices and procedures to react to the fast moving and unique challenges we currently face.

The challenge we face like many businesses is to ensure we support our staff, protect the business and the many contractors that support the airport on a regular basis.





# THE NIGHT SKY IN TATSFIELD – MAY 2020

Jupiter, Saturn and Mars are all visible in the (very) early morning sky. Nautical twilight ends and civil twilight begins at the point when the Sun is 6° below the horizon and lasts until sunrise.

At the beginning of May the transition from one to the other occurs just before 5am and is probably the latest time that you could expect to see the three planets before the sky becomes too bright. As the month progresses those planets rise earlier and earlier until by the last day of May you could just glimpse two of them by staying up late rather than by getting up early! On that date Jupiter and Saturn are above the south eastern horizon, although not by much, at half past midnight.

In the evenings Venus still dominates the west as soon as the Sun has set. It is at maximum brightness in the early part of the month although by then it is (apparently) moving back towards the Sun and will be lost in the solar glare before the end of May. If you get the chance to look at Venus through moderately sized binoculars or a telescope you will see that it displays a crescent shape exactly like the Moon. If the sky is clear on May 21st or 22nd the planet Mercury is extremely close to Venus on both these dates. On the 21st Mercury is  $1\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  below Venus and on the 22nd it is a similar distance to the east or left. For reference don't forget that the Moon is about  $\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  across and in reality appears much smaller than people tend to imagine.

Don't forget, during the evenings of enforced isolation, to step outside occasionally and just look up and be amazed at what you can see in a dark, clear night sky.

As you know I've often spoken here about, and promoted the role of, women in astronomy so it was with some sadness that recently we saw the passing of two females who had carved out a niche for themselves in their particular scientific field.

The first was Heather Couper who did so much to promote amateur astronomy both by her writings and by television appearances, sometimes with Patrick Moore on the "Sky at Night". I met her when she was Senior Lecturer at the planetarium in the Royal Observatory, Greenwich in the late 1970's. She left there to pursue her media interests, and soon after became the first ever female President of the British Astronomical Association. She was made a CBE in 2007 and has an asteroid named after her, 3922 Heather. She died in February at the age of 70.

The other lady played a key role more in space exploration than in astronomy although without her the space race could have developed very differently. She was Katherine Johnson who also passed away in February at the grand age of 101 and was one of the three females who inspired the book and film "Hidden Figures". This was the story of three African American women who fought against racial (and sometimes gender)

segregation and prejudice to make life easier and more accessible for those that followed. Johnson was responsible for the calculations and equations that were used to compute the orbits and trajectories for manned space capsules. It is a fact that having met her, John Glenn refused to lift off for the first ever American orbit of the Earth until Johnson had manually checked the calculations herself. The current head of NASA said they would ".....never forget her courage and leadership and the milestones we could not have reached without her".

We have also noticed an increase in bee activity - maybe they are enjoying the reduced pollution levels, as we are. The air smells cleaner, the sky seems more blue, the flowers more vivid. The views from the allotments have always been stunning, but now even more so. We are so lucky to live in this peaceful village.

# THE TATSFIELD GARDENER IN MAY

Life is very tough for old and young alike at the moment, but we must look forward to better days ahead and having some colour in the garden will be a great help in restoring our spirits. The THS Committee have decided to release to all gardeners in the village the special THS members discount arrangements with Suttons seeds; their website is working well at the moment (www.suttons.co.uk). If you order vegetable and flower seeds you will get a 50% discount and also 15% discount off other items – just quote the unique order code GS 1006F – go on have a look at my suggestions below and look forward to a happier and colourful summer!

Our local garden centre Westerham Heights (call on 571545 or email them on Westerham.heights@yahoo.co.uk) is taking orders and is open to customers to collect their orders; they deserve our support.

For a lovely splash of colour in the garden all you need is a packet of seed! Annual plants can now be sown directly into the garden, or containers, and will germinate in 7–14 days, they will grow quickly and be in flower in just a few weeks after germination. Try Cosmos, Nigella, Calendula (Cottage Marigolds), Cornflower, Sunflowers, Sweet Peas; or try annual climbers like Sweet Peas, Nasturtium and Morning Glory.

May is also a very good time to sow quick growing vegetable seeds. No need to have a garden plot, these seeds can be sown in a pot, a tray or any handy container. Try sowing a pinch of seed every few weeks to get continuity of supply and avoid a big crop all at one time. Quick growing vegetables include Spring Onions, Radishes, all sorts of leaves including Little Gem Lettuce, Annual Spinach, Courgettes, Haricot and other dwarf beans, Baby Beetroot, Mange Tout and Sugar Snap Peas, Mustard and Cress.

If you can get hold of vegetable plants in pots, look out for Tomatoes (try the super flavoured tiny cherry, yellow and plum types), Green, Red and Yellow Peppers, Aubergines and many more. These plants will grow well in containers as well as in garden soil.

There is nothing more satisfying than growing, picking and eating your own produce!

The old saying "If the Ash be before the Oak, we shall have a soak; but if the Oak be before the Ash then we shall have a splash" What do you think, will we have another dry summer? So far our rainfall levels are below average and I fancy the Oak is ahead of the Ash. We are watching with some anxiety to see how the Ash will do this year after such a bad year locally in 2019 with the dreaded Ash Dieback disease.

# ONE HUNDRED YEARS AGO THIS MONTH

Tatsfield's gradual return to 'normal' after the end of the First World War continued in the spring of 1920. Technological progress was noted in the local newspapers when they reported that the Post Office had received permission to install a 'telegraphic line' along Rag Hill Road. This was to connect with the existing line at Tatsfield Green and extend the service to a point opposite 'the Old Chalk Pit'. I can't find a chalk pit off Rag Hill Road on any of the maps in the archive, so its location remains a mystery.

Another item of good news that month was that after constant complaints from Tatsfield, the damage to the surface of Tatsfield Lane reported in the summer of 1919 had at last been repaired. This had apparently been caused by traffic to and from Biggin Hill aerodrome. The total cost was £194/5/1d!

On May 14<sup>th</sup>, the Surrey Mirror carried a long report of a court hearing after a fracas involving two Tatsfielders on their way home from Westerham on market day. Both described as 'dealers', they had been drinking at the George and Dragon, where one of them is alleged to have said he could drink more beer than he could pay for. There followed an argument about one of their horses and carts blocking the other. Witnesses for the plaintiff and the accused gave conflicting accounts of one of the dealers jumping into the other's cart, apparently armed with a knuckle-duster and cutting his adversary's eye. When they got back to Tatsfield, trouble started all over again and a whip was said to have been involved. One of the witnesses admitted to the clerk of the court that he had also had several drinks and could not exactly say what had happened. Both parties were bound over to keep the peace for six months.

After the upheaval and suffering of the war, political turmoil and revolution in continental Europe, there was a sign of a revival of political activity here in Tatsfield. It came at the end of May with this notice advertising a meeting outside the Ship to discuss whether Tatsfield voters wanted Nationalism or Socialism. The choice was said to be between

"industrial prosperity and happiness under a progressive and representative government" and "industrial conscription and discontent under Socialist bureaucrats". There was not to be a general election for another couple of years.

# PAST EPIDEMICS

**'Spanish Flu'** – Apart from the cancellation or postponement of some social events, there are few references in the Tatsfield archives to indicate the effect on the parish of the 'Spanish Flu' epidemic at the end of the First World War in 1918. 50 million people are believed to have died in that worldwide pandemic. There are however indications in newspaper reports of what life was like then and in the next couple of years in neighbouring areas.

At one stage, Westerham's schools were closed because of influenza but there were also outbreaks of German measles, measles and whooping cough at that time. In Sevenoaks, the town's medical officer recommended *"the establishment of a body of persons skilled in sick nursing and home management, who could be quickly mobilised to help the stricken homes in the event of an epidemic"*. This was before the welfare state. People relied on subscribing to 'friendly societies' for medical care. A meeting of the Tunbridge Wells branch of the Equitable Friendly Society was told of record sums being paid out in sickness benefit. Nevertheless, the society's finances were in good shape.

On this side of the county border, school attendance was down to 82 percent, partly because of the war, but mainly because of influenza. Only seven of the 24 schools in East Surrey had not been closed at some point and 20 had been closed for several weeks in 1919. In the Reigate area, there were two waves of influenza in 1919, resulting in a total of 69 deaths. The shortage of medical and nursing staff at Redhill Hospital was reported as was the problem of finding beds for cases of severe influenza that could be isolated from surgical cases.

**The 1665 Plague** - The late Doris Geary, who lived at Pond Cottages in the 1980s, wrote a history of Tatsfield – 'Tales of Tatsfield' in 1987. In her book, she recounts that when the Great Plague was at its worst in London in 1665, people who could afford to travel made their way out of the capital to country villages. *"It is reputed that Pond Cottages were used to house the folk of Tatsfield, who caught the plague. At one time, Pond Cottages were known as `Pestilence Houses"*. Mrs Geary also recalled that William Tapsell told her that when he was a young lad in late Victorian times that: *"he had a very bad throat infection. He was very ill, and was taken to Pond Cottages and looked after by other sick people there. Food came up from Oxted for them, by horse and trap. This was left outside by the pond for five minutes, or until the driver of the horse and trap was out of range and at that point, a bell was rung. Mr Tapsell said that when he was better, he was sent to get the food which had been left outside. He was away from home eight or nine weeks".* 






